weekly bulletin, *Sea Star eNews*, to help ensure timely communication and to continue to reduce the volume of paper/fliers sent home. Please refer to the green instruction flyer in this newsletter to sign-up for the *Sea Star eNews*. (Those already signed-up do NOT need to re-register.) Classroom assignments will be e-mailed as follows:

Kindergarten: Wednesday, August 31 at 5:00 P.M.

Grades 1-5: Friday, September 2 at 5:00 P.M.

Unlike private schools that have cutoff deadlines, we enroll new students through the first day (and after) of school, and thus are uncertain of the exact number of students in each grade until the school year is underway. As a result, **no changes in class assignments will be made until the class size configuration at each grade level is correct.** We will make this determination as soon as possible after the first day of school. I thank you in advance for your patience and understanding.

Under the dynamic leadership of PTA President, Terri Yost, the PTA has a multitude of fabulous activities and programs planned for the year! Find out how you can get involved at our first PTA meeting on **Monday, September 19 at 7:00 P.M.** in the cafeteria.

Take care and enjoy those last few precious days of summer with your family and friends!

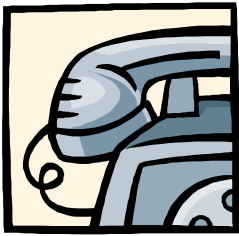

Art Reflections Competition 2011-2012: "Diversity Means..."



After reflecting on the theme "Diversity Means...", ask your Sea Star artist to create a piece of artwork, take a photo, compose a song, choreograph a dance, produce a film, or write a story about what it means to them. All students can participate in the competition.

Since 1969, the National PTA Reflections Program has encouraged students across the nation and in American schools overseas to explore their artistic talents. The Art Reflections Program promotes an appreciation for the arts, by giving students an opportunity to express themselves creatively and receiving positive recognition for their artistic endeavors.

Reflections Program submissions may be developed in or outside of school as long as the entries are new pieces inspired by the current year's theme and created expressly for the program.

Sea Star students can submit entries in any of these six art categories:

- Literature
- Photography
- Visual arts
- Film/Video Production
- Dance Choreography
- Musical Composition

All levels of ability are encouraged to enter and all participants are awarded for their participation.

Entries will be reviewed for creativity and interpretation of the theme. In both divisions (Kindergarten -2nd grade and 3rd-5th grade), the top three entries in each category will advance to the PTA Council to compete with other schools in our area. In the past, the Huntington Seacliff winners of visual arts and photography have had their art displayed in the Huntington Beach Central Library. This year, it could be your little artist!

Look for the Reflections box in the main office. **All entries are due by October 12, 2011.**

Welcome Seacliff Kindergarten Class of 2011-2012

Whether this is your first child entering kindergarten, or your third, we want to make sure that your first day of kindergarten is a special and memorable one. Here is what to expect on the first day of school...

Arrival Time—8:05 am: Class begins promptly at 8:05 am. When you arrive in the kindergarten area, please have your child sit down in line by his/her room number and help him/her make friends with the children around him/her in line. The children are not allowed to run on the playground or play on the equipment before school, but they can chat with their buddies in their lines.

Snack/Recess— 9:15 am-9:30 am or 9:30 am-9:45 am: Be sure to send a nutritious snack with your child each day. Remember to pack items in easy to open containers—you won't be there to open things up for them!

Lunch/recess—11:01-11:46 am: Students may bring a lunch from home or purchase hot lunches for \$2.50 per day. The food services department has a computerized point of sale system which allows you to prepay for lunches by depositing funds into your child's account. You can send checks or cash with your child to school and the lunch staff will credit his/her account the same day. Online deposits are also available through the district website, <http://www.hbcasd.k12.ca.us>. If you choose not to put money in your child's account, your child can bring \$2.50 cash daily. Monthly menus will be sent home. You are invited to join your child any day for lunch. Be sure to sign in at the front office before doing so. Please note that children who do not attend Seacliff, including siblings, are not permitted on campus.

Remember to pack items in easy to open containers—you won't be there to open things up for them. Parents are discouraged from dropping off lunch midday. Lunches are not delivered to the classrooms, however, students are instructed to check with the office to pick up a delivered lunch if they don't have a lunch so that they don't go without eating. Thank you for helping us by sending your child to school prepared every day.

When the school day ends, parents meet their children on the kindergarten playground after school is over. Children will be sitting in line by his/her room number. **Please don't stay and socialize in the pick-up area because it is hard for the teachers to know which children have been picked up and which children are still waiting for their parents. It is essential that all kindergarten cars leave QUICKLY to make room for the primary dismissal/pick up.**

KINDERGARTEN KICKOFF THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 1ST

Kindergarten Kick-off will be on Thursday, September 1st from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on the kindergarten playground. The kindergarten students and their parents will be able to meet the kindergarten teachers and attend a classroom orientation from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. Afterwards, the P.T.A will provide a special snack from 10:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on the playground

A few reminders:

- ♥ Label EVERYTHING.
- ♥ Make sure your child has a backpack large enough to carry a standard pocket folder. Check the backpack every day—teachers will send home a weekly newsletter along with any other communication via the backpack.
- ♥ Do not allow your child to bring toys to school unless it is Share Day.
- ♥ The playground is a sunny place—remember the sunscreen.
- ♥ There is no naptime in kindergarten—this can be a time of adjustment so you may want to get your kindergartner to bed early.
- ♥ On the first day, students should arrive and depart from school in their usual manner, whether on foot, by car, or on the bus, to provide practice and cause less confusion.

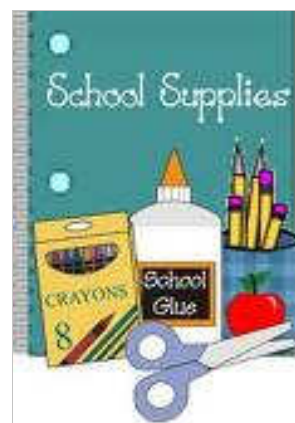
